
## Common Types of Tobacco

- **2.** A light air-cured, low-sugar tobacco used primarily for cigarette production
- **6.** Tobaccos indigenous to the eastern Mediterranean region, including the various "Turkish" tobaccos and Latakia
- **7.** A dark tobacco that is cured in barns over an open fire and generally used as a component in many blends
- **8.** A process of curing and by pressing tobacco, heating it from fire or steam, and then allowing it to ferment

## Down

- **1.** A "spice" tobacco grown only in St. James Parish, Louisiana
- **3.** Somewhat sweet tobaccos with spicy flavor that are grown throughout the eastern Mediterranean region, and include Basma, Smyrna, Xanthi, Samsun, Izmir, Drama, and Yenidje
- **4.** A specially prepared tobacco originally produced in Syria and named after the port city
- **5.** Tobacco with several varieties, characterized with a relatively high sugar content, and grown in many areas
